2. Main features

Course objectives

After completing this course, students will have reached the level of CEFR A1/A1.

Brief description of the course

The aim of this general beginner Spanish course is to help students acquire basic grammatical structures and communication skills for everyday topics. The curriculum covers introductions, living and home, daily routine and family, while students will learn about ser and estar verbs, participle and retroflex pronouns, gustar-type structures and the pretérito perfecto. By the end of the course, participants will be able to hold simple conversations and use basic vocabulary confidently in everyday situations.
