Course objectives
General and Specialised Spanish - Advanced: the course provides students with a C1 level of Spanish, with vocabulary covering topics in general and specialised linguistic contexts.
Brief description of the course
The aim of the Spanish for International Relations course is to develop students' vocabulary, grammatical knowledge and oral and written skills on topics related to their profession. The course will cover current and relevant topics such as states and governments, diplomacy and protocol, the specificities of Hungary and Spanish-speaking countries, religion, society, human rights and international conflicts. Theoretical knowledge and language skills are put to use through practical exercises and communication activities.
